

1. Blow-up the wing template to the size you require using a photocopier. Place the template over your poster board and mark it out.



2. Cut out the shape carefully using a craft knife. You can use dinner plates to cut around for a neat curve between each point. Repeat for the other wing.



3. Draw in the lines from the centre to the wing tips, and glue wooden lolly (popsicle) sticks in a row to each point. Start at the wing tips and work back to ensure you have a full-length stick at each tip. Trim them as necessary to fit when you reach the centre.



4. Cut four lengths of faux leather or cardboard for your handles. Glue the backs together to make them double-strength, and then pierce with the tip of your craft knife to make two holes at each end for the paper-fastener to go through.



5. Push the fasteners through, then mark in position where you want your handles to be on the wing. Pierce the wing and push the handles through, folding back the fasteners on the back of the wings to hold in place.



- 6. Place the wings alongside each other in a wingspan shape and draw out a paper template for the joining shape, which should look like this one (left). The size and width will depend on your wing size. Don't worry about making this perfect and symmetrical.
- 7. Cut two of these shapes out of your faux leather and glue together back to back in the centre. Slide your wings between the two pieces at each end and use more paper fasteners to secure in place.
